

What is Child Sexual Exploitation?

- A form of sexual abuse.
- When children and young people receive “something” (e.g. food, alcohol, drugs, cigarettes, somewhere to stay) for taking part in sexual activity.
- When offenders have power over their victims.
- When perceived consent does not undermine the abusive nature of the act.

- Arcades

- Public parks

What are the signs to be aware of?

- Young male or female checking in with a significantly older person.
- Multiple Adults and young people checking into the rooms.
- Guests who are in and out of the hotel at irregular hours.
- Last minute/walk in bookings – paying by cash.
- Bookings made in different names to those who check in.
- A young person who looks fearful, nervous, withdrawn or uncomfortable and doesn’t speak for themselves.
- Young person being taken into a hotel room by, or visited by, one or more adults who do not seem to be family members.
- Parties in rooms – complaints about the noise.
- Guests who request a specific room that is isolated and private.
- Signs of sexual activity – lots of condoms wrappers.
- Room Service – alcohol orders for guests who appear to be underage.
- Guests who do not request their rooms to be cleaned.
- Guests who appear secretive or try to conceal their activities in their rooms.
- Young person being out late on a school night/overnight.
- Overly sexualised language/ behaviour.
- Indications of sexual activity involving a young person who you know or suspect to be under 16 years of age.

How does this make me feel?

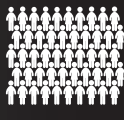
- I’m worried for them?

If you have concerns about a young person or a situation you have witnessed **call 101**

Always take notice of behaviour, note descriptions of individuals/clothing/vehicles.

And remember CSE relates to anyone aged under 18 years.



Sexual exploitation affects **thousands of children and young people** across the UK every year.



CSE involves perpetrators grooming their victims in a range of ways, such as in **person, via mobiles or online**, to gain their trust before emotionally and sexually abusing them for their own gain.



Despite common perception, this is an issue that affects both **girls AND boys** alike.

Victims are often **too scared** to come forward, or might not even recognise that they are being exploited. They need our help.



Most sexual exploitation **takes place in private**, but public places are often used to meet, groom and abuse young people.



Children are most vulnerable to sexual exploitation between the **ages of 13 and 15**, but younger victims are being targeted all the time.
