
Aim 1: By December 2018, **100%** of children who have been looked after at **home or in kinship care for more than 2 years**, on or after 6 June 2018, will have a **24 month review** looking at their whole period of time being looked after at home or in kinship care on a Compulsory Supervision Order.

Aim 2: By 1 July 2019, **80%** of children who become looked after and accommodated, on or after 1 October 2018, will have a **recommendation for permanence within 30 weeks (7 months)** of becoming accommodated.




Method

We looked at baseline data to understand our system and help us set our Aims.



- Process mapping helped us to identify areas of drift and delay & think of tests of change.
- We looked at the challenges in our system to help us develop our driver diagrams for Aims 2 and 3.

Process Change

- We are at the early stages of identifying tests of change as part of our process mapping exercises and developing our driver diagrams.
- We are developing a plan to **scale up Aim 1** (reviews of children's plans on CSOs 2+ years in kinship care or at home) to all localities in Argyll and Bute. We will also be creating a "trigger" point in our process to routinely review children's plans who have been on a CSO for 2+ years.
- We are in early discussions to test the 2 Week Review in order to have an early focus on permanence planning and set timescales for reports and assessments.

Achievements

- •PACE has raised the profile of permanence planning in our area and given it a **shared ownership between agencies**.
- •Further strengthened our already positive relationships and communication between agencies.
- •Renewed **enthusiasm** in all agencies to improve outcomes for looked after children.

Conclusions

•It is too early to draw any conclusions as we haven't begun testing yet — but we are excited to start testing!

Key Learning Points

- •Power of data the data presented at the launch Workshop really helped us to understand how children are currently moving through our system. It made us realise that we need to focus on the early stages of permanence planning to effectively reduce drift and delay.
- •Process mapping allowed all agencies to understand all parts of the process.
- •We have a greater understanding of each other's roles and responsibilities, and the expectations and timescales that all agencies should be adhering to.

Next Steps

- •Complete the **reviews for Aim 1** (children on CSOs for 2+ years at home or in kinship care) and **scale** this to all localities in Argyll and Bute.
- Begin testing our change ideas for Aim 2.
