



Life expectancy: Scotland & other Western European Countries, 1851-2005 Source: Human Mortality Database




Prevalence of smoking by country, in 15 year olds by sex, 2000/01, Europe






Coronary heart disease mortality Men aged 15-74 years

Liverpool LSOAs: income deprivation distribution



Glasgow merged DZs: income deprivation distribution




Standardised mortality rates by cause, all ages: Glasgow relative to Liverpool & Manchester



Cirrhosis mortality males 15-44












CSF CRF CONCENTRATIONS IN DIFFERENTIALLY-REARED JUVENILE PRIMATES:

Attachment theory

- Ainsworth
 - Deep emotional connection that infant develops with primary caregiver
 - Reflects an "internal working model" expressing the infant's expectations of parental behaviour in meaningful situations
 - Basis for development of later relationships
- Increasingly recognised as determinant of later emotional, cognitive and social outcomes






Social connectedness

- 148 studies comprising 308,849 participants, high levels of social integration conferred a 50% increased likelihood of survival.
- Complex patterns of social integration conferred a 90% increase in survival.
- Simple indicators such as living alone versus living with others conferred a survival benefit of only 19%.

Alienation and Frankenstein

□ "I came across people, other beings which I could see were almost like myself. Or so I thought at first when I approached them, though, I found that they did not consider me as one of their own kind. As soon as they saw me, their faces became twisted with fear. 



Hospital Standardised Mortality Ratios (Seasonally Adjusted) Scotland: Oct-Dec 2002 to Jan-Mar 2012

Rectorial Address

• "Let me right at the outset define what I mean by alienation. It is the cry of men who feel themselves the victims of blind economic forces beyond their control. It's the frustration of ordinary people excluded from the processes of decision making.
