


What's been achieved by the Permanence & Care Excellence (PACE) programme so far...



Creation of communities of staff working as a whole system in 22 local authority and HSCP areas


Seven local authority and HSCP areas are using the child's timeline to illustrate permanence journeys and influence decision makers






100% of PACE sites use Quality Improvement methodology to drive improvement

We will offer PACE to the remaining 10 local authority and HSCP areas by December 2018





Reduction by over half the time it takes to make permanence recommendations for children in two local authority and HSPC areas to 28 weeks

Four local authority and HSCP areas have introduced a looked after review within two weeks of a child becoming looked after and accommodated






We are setting the standard for robust practice to deliver permanence for children against timely milestones

Data in a number of local authority and HSCP areas now captures returning home or kinship placement on a permanence recommendation for children





22 local authority and HSPC areas are using data to understand their childrens' journeys and evidence improvement

Data trackers in several local authority and HSPC areas are tracking 100% of looked after children, to drive planning and catch drift and delay for children early






A number of local authority and HSCP areas are recognising the value of acquiring legal advice before permanency planning looked after review

Improvements to services currently engaged in PACE could impact on the lives of 9,000 looked after children in Scotland





In two local authority and HSCPs areas, 100% of children have a recommendation for permanence in seven and a half months or less

Five local authority and HSCP areas have four specific aims that cover looked after children's whole journeys, and we are working to ensure all PACE sites have four aims
