

# Progressing with PACE:



What's been achieved by the Permanence & Care Excellence (PACE) programme so far



Creation of communities of staff working as a whole system in 15 local authorities



100% of PACE sites use Quality Improvement methodology to drive improvement



Reduction by over half the time it takes to make permanence recommendations for children in two local authority areas to 28 weeks



Data tracker is tracking 100% of looked after children in one area driving planning and catching drift and delay for children early



16 local authorities are using data to understand their children's journeys and evidence improvement



Improvements to services engaged in PACE could impact on lives of 7,000 looked after children in Scotland



Plans to create six more PACE sites



100% of looked after children have child's plans in one local authority



4 local authorities are thinking about kinship care in ways they haven't done before



Independent Reviewing Officer focussing on kinship care resulting in finding appropriate placements at an earlier stage in one local authority



Reduction by a third the number of children on Supervision Orders at home in one local authority



80 to 90% of children under 12, in one local authority, have a permanence decision within 9 months



3 months off the time it takes to present children to its permanence panel in one local authority
